Cadence is part of the Upper Grand District School Board and is designed to engage students who are at risk of not graduating from highschool and chronic non-attenders.

Cadence is located at an offsite building called Hope House in downtown Guelph. Hope House is a downtown outreach that serves more than 500 families who are in need in our community.

Three teachers created and deliver the the 4 credit program under the ospices of the Student Success department of the Upper Grand District School Board.

Genrally our students are credit poor and don't fit well into the regular school system. Many of our students are coping with a variety of issues such as mental health, their home situations and minimal personal leadership skills.

Cadence is blessed to have many community partners who without we would not experience the success we have had with our students. Our biggest community support comes from Muskoka Woods, Lakeside Hope House, Larry Pearson and The Groves Family.

BUDGET/STAFFING

Our resources are all met through the overwhelming support of our community partners and the Upper Grand District School Board.

Indicators for success are growth in self esteem, demonstrated leaderhip skills, credits earned, graduation rates and seeking positive change in their life.

What has been the impact on Student Learning?

Our hope at Cadence is to provide our students with enough leadership skills that they will be inspired to shape their own world.
